*General Motors Corporation Executive Fritz Henderson to Join Foundation's Board of Trustees*

(New York, NY) The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation's Board of Trustees announces the election of Frederick "Fritz" Henderson as a Trustee, effective immediately. Mr. Henderson is Vice Chairman and Chief Financial Officer (CFO) of General Motors Corporation. "Fritz Henderson brings a wide range of business experience along with a wealth of global knowledge and experience to the foundation," said Stephen Brown, Chairman, Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Board of Trustees. "His contribution will be particularly valuable to the foundation's work in the tradition of our founder."

Mr. Henderson has been Vice Chairman and CFO at General Motors since January 2006. He is known for his ability to lead complex organizations, and driving business results in some of the most demanding markets. He is credited with the restructuring of the automaker's European operation in 2005, leading its thriving Asia-Pacific division in 2002 and running GM's operation in Latin America, Africa and the Middle East before that. He joined General Motors in 1984 when he was hired as a senior financial analyst. Mr. Henderson holds a master's degree in business administration from Harvard University and a bachelor's degree in business administration from the University of Michigan's Ross School of Business.
