Alfred P. Sloan Foundation Announces New Vice President

Leisle Lin joins organization as Vice President, Finance and Board Secretary

(New York, NY) The Alfred P. Sloan Foundation announces that Leisle Lin will join the organization as Vice President, Finance and as Board Secretary.

Lin is currently Executive Vice President at the Nathan Cummings Foundation, where she directs and coordinates finance, investments and grants management, and oversees human resources and administration.

Lin will be responsible for budgeting, finance, foundation governance, compliance, and other management responsibilities at the \$1.6-billion Alfred P. Sloan Foundation. The Foundation makes grants primarily to support original research and broad-based education related to science, technology, economic performance and the quality of American life.

Chair of the board's finance committee, she is also the Treasurer of Philanthropy New York.

Lin graduated *cum laude* with a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics from Yale University and received a Master of Science degree in accounting from the Stern School of Business at New York University. Lin will join the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation effective July 1, 2010.
